Tumuaki / Principal's Column

Kia ora e ngā whānau me ngā hoa o te Kura Tuatahi of Goodwood.

This is my last newsletter column for a little while.

Next term I am away on a sabbatical researching ways that mainstream schools can support learners who are neurodiverse. Sabbaticals are exciting (contestable) opportunities offered to school leaders and teachers as part of our respective collective agreements.

During my leave I am fortunate to be heading to the United Kingdom to connect with researchers, school leaders and facilitators who specialise in this area. I also have time to visit some New Zealand contexts and to read widely and with depth. I will also publish a report on my findings which I hope will be of benefit to Goodwood staff and explorers as well as other schools. My last sabbatical was in 2018 and I investigated the concept of preview, which you may note is widely implemented at Goodwood and has also been used by a number of other schools across the country. All costs for my leave and travel are covered by the Ministry of Education or by me personally.

While I will certainly miss you all while I am away, I know that I couldn't be leaving our school in better hands. We have a highly experienced and capable leadership team with a combined 47 years at Goodwood (don't ask who has been here the longest!) Marsha Copping will be our acting principal, leading with her usual expertise and ethos of care. Marsha will be ably supported by Lynda Alton as her deputy and Jess Simons who will cover Lynda's associate principal duties. Deb Taylor will complete an outstanding leadership team.

My sabbatical will start in London where I am being hosted by [The Anna Freud](#) team. I will be attending conferences, connecting with educators and visiting schools in London and around the country. I am also travelling to Sheffield to work with the leadership team of the [Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools](#) (PINS) programme.

This work is crucial. Schools are being required to support learners with increasingly complex needs while managing a seemingly inverse reduction in funding and support. Goodwood is being particularly disadvantaged as one of the 60% of schools not to be allocated a Learning Support Coordinator and having the lowest equity index funding score in our area, further reducing available support. This means that our accommodations have to be increasingly creative as we strive to balance the need for inclusivity with the rights of all explorers to make progress to their potential. We also need to support our hard working and caring team as they balance these, sometimes competing demands.

I look forward to seeing what other school leaders are trialling and accomplishing. The opportunity to visit other educators in their schools and universities is a privilege and an honour.

CCTV at Goodwood

We have 24 hour CCTV installed at Goodwood School. These cameras are here to protect our premises, our explorers and our team. The prime function of our CCTV is to discourage and follow up on after hours damage or anti-social behaviour. On very rare occasions we do view camera footage if an explorer has been hurt at a break time and we have heard different perspectives regarding what has happened. We use the camera information to follow up as needed and to ensure everyone's safety moving forward. We have robust CCTV policies that adhere to the Privacy Act 2020 and these can be viewed at any time at School Docs - search Goodwood School username **goodwood** password **explore** The cameras do not have audio and are well away from sensitive areas such as bathrooms.



Written School Reports - sent out next week

These reports will also show your child's interim achievement against the levels of the New Zealand Curriculum along with planned next steps in their learning.
