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Tumuaki / Principal's Column

Kia ora e ngā whānau me ngā hoa o te Kura Tuatahi of Goodwood. As Dorothy famously said " there's no place like home!"

It is great to be back after a wonderful sabbatical. I had the real privilege of visiting a number of schools, centres and universities across the United Kingdom. The generosity of the many teachers, leaders, researchers, children and families I met was truly appreciated.

My time away also allowed me to acknowledge just how special our school is, and I am looking forward to a great term ahead.

The trip allowed me to do two really important things. The first was to connect with leading researchers and educators as they grappled with a worldwide challenge in how to meet the increasingly complex learning and social needs of a wide range of learners. The second was to reflect on the work we are doing in Aotearoa, and at Goodwood in particular, by contrasting our practice with that of a completely different jurisdiction.

I was able to achieve both objectives. The work of the <u>Anna Freud</u> organisation was particularly inspirational. Established by the 'founder' of modern child psychology (and daughter of Sigmund) Anna Freud, the centre leads cutting edge research, professional development and consultancy as well as providing a school for students with high and complex needs.

Attending the UK national SENDCo (Special Educational Needs / Disabilities Coordinators) and Child Mental Health Conferences allowed me to connect with internationally renowned theorists and researchers. Visits to leading UK schools allowed me to view high quality provision at the 'chalkface.'

Each experience has sharpened my thinking and helped me to develop a deeper understanding and appreciation of the complexities of supporting learners who are neurodivergent. Each experience also illuminated the wonderful work that is happening at our school. Many of the initiatives our team has implemented in recent years, including regulation stations, soft starts, explorer led clubs and preview are viewed as world class practice.

What was also clear was that our practice runs 'on the smell of an oily rag' and the generosity of highly dedicated school leaders and teachers (and whānau). Our operational funding for inclusion (determined largely by our equity / decile ranking) is around \$18000 or enough to fund half of one teacher aide. Our school finds almost 10 x this amount to provide six wonderful teacher aides who work across our 18 classrooms. In the UK a teacher aide per class was the norm for schools serving communities of a similar type and size to ours.

Due to inadequate funding to fully meet the increasingly complex needs of our explorers we need to work with innovation and creativity. We also need to work together as this is community work. My final report explores some of these ideas and I look forward to sharing it with you all

following its current peer review. I also look forward to extrapolating some of the ideas through future newsletters. This is important work.

Time to complete this work was a privilege and was only possible due to the dedication and hard work of our team. I would like to thank Marsha and Lynda and our teaching and support teams on such a successful term. Knowing that our school and explorers were in such great hands made my travel and study all the more enjoyable.

Every day matters!


You will have no doubt seen the new <u>Ministry of Education initiatives</u> to increase rates of attendance at schools. While details are still being developed we will be required to introduce a new 'stepped' (STAR) approach as determined by Associate Minister Seymour. Much of the new initiative will reinforce our current practice and you will know that we have been working in partnership with you on attendance matters for a while now. What is new is the government's 'steps' relating to levels of absence including directing the Ministry to take a more active role in prosecution processes.

So how are we going? Our term 3 data is hot of the press and shows that 60% of our explorers attended regularly (according to the MOE definition of >90% of the time) This is below the government's target of 80% regular attendance. Interestingly around a quarter of our term three absences were due to term time holidays.


Term 3 Summary

Our overall attendance is interesting. Generally around 90% of our explorers are at school on a given day (regular attendance per explorer is a very different measure). Monday and Friday attendance is below that of the other week days!



Term 4 - potae/hats required - sun protection

Goodwood School aims to:

- protect our students and staff from excessive exposure to UVR while they are at school, or involved with off-site school activities, including sports and Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC)
- educate the whole school community about the harmful effects of excessive exposure to UVR, and how to keep themselves safe.

We inform and remind all staff, parents, and other members of the school community (such as coaches, volunteers, etc) about our sun protection policy.

We educate our students about sun safety by communicating age-appropriate information about sun exposure and protection. We provide this information annually in class programmes for every year level.

Timing of the policy



Our sun protection policy applies between 10 am and 4 pm, during terms 1 and 4.

Students are to wear wide brimmed hats. Goodwood hats are available at the school office for \$20.

Staff are encouraged to model appropriate sunsafe behaviour by wearing sun protective hats and clothing, sunscreen, and making use of shade whenever possible. Parents are also encouraged to wear sunhats and be positive role models when picking up children or participating in school activities.
